Bloom:	Large single blooms with a timeless elegance. Beautiful fragrant flowers. Palest blush pink blooms with unique vibrant coral centers, carried on sturdy stems that do not flop. Repeat blooming.
Bloom Period:	Spring. Repeating summer & fall.
Foliage:	Blue green foliage.
Habit:	Compact mounding habit 11" x 11". Comparable habit to the Scent First® Tall Portfolio.
Propagation:	Tip Cuttings. <i>License required for propagation.</i>
Culture:	Well-drained soil in full sun. Trim back after summer blooming to encourage new growth & repeat fall blooming.
Additional Comments:	Vernalization beneficial, 6-8weeks at 41°F. Improved disease resistance. A robust drought resistant perennial once established. Great for picking.
Uses:	Pots & containers, garden border, modern landscape, long-lasting cut flower.
